## TREGO MAN SLAIN; TAKEN FOR A DEER

Information was received here today of the killing of Wilbur Coc of Trego, who was shot in mistake for a deer near Trego by Clarence De Lager last Thursday evening.

Both men were employed at the O'Mailey tie camp, and about 6 p. m., Thursday De Lager took a Krug-Jorgensen rife and went deer hunting. He circled, and when back near the camp heard a noise in the brush and fired, striking Coc. The bullet passed through his chost, puncturing his spine, and killing him instantly.

A coroner's inquest was held at Eureka Saturday morning, the jury finding that Coe came to his death accidentally, and exonerating De-Lager. Later in the day DeLager was arraigned before Justice Frost. at Eureka, charged with manslaughter, and he was bound over to the district court in the sum of \$1,000. Ite was unable to furnish bail, and was taken in custody by Sheriff Bauey of Lincoln county. Coe leaves a wife and eight children. DeLager who is 21, came to Trego about six weeks ago from Shelby, but his home is said to be in Valier. At the inquest it developed that Coe was shot from a distance of only 46 feet. The accident occurred at about 7 o'clock.
