**WILLIAM F. EMORY IS DROWNED AT CORAM**

William F. Emory, an employe of the George Diller logging camp near Coram, was drowned in the Flathead river about 8 o'clock this morning, and at the hour of going to press the body had not been recovered.

The logging camp is across the river from Coram, and it is said that Emory attempted to swim a team across the stream to get them shod at Coram. He was riding one horse and leading the other, and when he got about midstream the horse he was riding began to flounder, when he got off and was drowned in attempting to swim back to shore. The team turned back, and made shore safely.

Sheriff McMillan was notified and he and Deputy Korb went to Coram to organize a searching party. They enlisted the aid of Dr. Rod Houston, who is an expert boatman, and are making a thorough search of all the eddies and whirlpools.

It is said that Emory is about 35 or 40 years of age, and came here from Salem, Oregon.

**BODY OF W. F. EMORY FOUND BY CCC BOYS**

The body of William F. Emory, who was drowned in the Flathead river near Coram July 17, was found about 6 o'clock Saturday evening at the head of a sand bar near the mouth of Bad Rock canyon by a group of CCC boys who were returning to camp at Coram.

Coroner Campbell was notified by H. James, Missoula, one of the CCC group, and left immediately with Sheriff McMillan to recover the body, which was found to be in a bad state of decomposition.

Emory was employed at the George Diller logging camp, and lost his life when attempting to swim a team across the river at Coram.
