William Gretzinger, 73 year old bachelor of the Columbia Falls vicinity, was found dead in his cabin this morning by Sheriff McMillan, Coroner Campbell and Dr. Kell of Columbia Falls.

Gretzinger who has lived around Columbia Falls for the past 35 years was last seen alive a little over a week ago, and this morning a neighbor living near him became alarmed and notified Dr. Kell of his absence. Gretzinger lived in a cabin just north of the Great Northern tracks near Half Moon. Coroner Campbell reports his death occurred by natural causes and believed he had been dead for nearly a week. No funeral arrangements have yet been made.
