This afternoon Raymond Waggener, of Waggener & Campbell, received a telephone call stating that a man had been found dead on the highway near Bad Rock canyon. Mr. Waggener did not get the message clearly, but understood the message to say that John Hall had found his father dead on the highway, but he did not learn whether the death was due to an accident or natural causes. No official report had been made at the hour of going to press.

**HALL'S DEATH DUE TO
CEREBRAL HEMORRHAGE**

Coroner Campbell last evening investigated the death of John Hall, Sr. of Bad Rock, and found that it was due to a cerebral hemorrhage.

Mr. Hall, who was 75 years of age, lived with his son at Bad Rock, and yesterday shortly after noon went for a walk. At about 12:45 a man operating a road grader found him dead beside the road. He went to the home of John Hall, Jr. to telephone, and when Mr. Hall went to investigate he found that the dead man was his father.

The funeral will be held Thursday at 2 p. m. at the Waggener and Campbell chapel, with Rev. Koehler of the Methodist church officiating. Interment will be in Conrad Memorial cemetery, with the Masonic Lodge of Columbia Falls conducting services at the grave.

Mr. Hall was an old resident of the Bad Rock section, and was well known and highly esteemed.
