**MRS. ALICE LEHMAN TAKES HER OWN LIFE**

Mrs. Alice Lehman of the Dew Drop Inn east of Coram took her own life Saturday afternoon. Mrs. Lehman was 39 years of age and had been in poor health for some time. She was alone in the house at the time and her husband and two other men were working near the rear of the building. She came to the door and spoke to them about 2:30 and was not seen again. One of the men went to get a drink of water about 4 o'clock and on opening the rear door saw Mrs. Lehman on the floor with a 25-35 rifle. The other men were called to the door and the place locked until Coroner Campbell and Sheriff McMillan arrived.

Mrs. Lehman had talked to her friends about her condition before, as well as to several others and her act was not a complete surprise. Relatives of Mrs. Lehman arrived from Butte today. Funeral services will be held Tuesday afternoon at 2 o'clock at the Waggener & Campbell chapel followed by interment in the Conrad Memorial cemetery.
