Spokane, Wash., April 10.—(AP)—Judge Charles W. Pomeroy, 68, of Kalispell, Mont., died at a hospital here today after an illness of less than a week.

The jurist, who entered the hospital last Friday for an operation, was a Past Grand Commander of the Grand Commandery, Knights Templar of Montana, and a Past Grand Master of the Masons. His widow, Estelle, who accompanied him here, was at the bedside.

Other survivors include two daughters, Miss Velma and Alice Pomeroy, of Kalispell.

Judge Pomeroy had been a president of Kalispell for 40 years, and was prominent in legal, civic and fraternal circles. The body will be taken to Kalispell tomorrow morning by the widow.

A special communication of the Grand Lodge of Masons for Montana will be opened at the Masonic Temple on Friday, April 12th, at 3:30 o'clock, p. m. This communication has been called for the purpose of conducting funeral services for our late Brother Past Grand Master C. W. Pomeroy. Past Masters are especially urged to attend. Public service will be held at the Presbyterian church, commencing at 3:30 o'clock.
