Fort Peck, Mont., July 20.—Crushed in the cabin of his truck by a break in the apparatus supporting the load of shale he was hauling from the spillway, George W. Rush, 39, employed by spillway builders, died in the hospital here.

A blood transfusion was administered but Rush failed to rally.

INDIAN AGENT DIES IN AN AUTO-TRAIN CRASH AT EUREKA

Fred Ryckman, agent of an Indian village across the line from Gateway, was so badly injured when the car in which he was riding collided with a Great Northern train at Eureka late Saturday afternoon that he died soon afterward and Patrick Barrroughs of the Canadian Mounted Police was so badly injured that there is some doubt as to his recovery.

Ryckman died on the way to the hospital, and an inquest is being held at Eureka this afternoon.

Barrroughs' leg and shoulders were broken, the sight of one eye was destroyed, and he has many bad cuts and bruises.

It is said that the men had been at the depot in Eureka, got in their car, and drove in front of the train, a fast freight, westbound.
