**SCHOKNECHT DEATH  
BELIEVED DUE TO  
NATURAL CAUSES**

The death of Henry Schoknecht, Jr., which occurred Saturday while he was at work at the J. Neils Lumber Company logging operations at Echo Lake, was due to natural causes in the opinion of Coroner Campbell who made a thorough investigation.

The body was found by his brother, Mark, a short distance from the camp, where he had gone to blaze a trail for the logging crews. He was reclining in a natural position, his gloves and axe had been carefully laid on the ground beside him, and there was no evidence whatever of any violence. About five years ago he had a serious accident, and since that time he has submitted to two major surgical operations, which Mr. Campbell thinks may have been factors contributing to his sudden death, which was probably due to a heart attack or cerebral hemorrhage.

It had been his custom to come to the camp at noon and take lunches to the logging crew, which was working several miles away. When he did not appear as usual at noon Saturday Mark Schoknecht investigated and found the body at about 1 p. m.

Funeral services will be held Tuesday afternoon at Trinity Lutheran church at 2:30 by Rev. A. L. Jordan followed by interment in the Conrad Memorial cemetery. The body is now at the Wagener and Campbell chapel where brief services will be held for the family just before going to the church.

While loading logs at Lupfer late yesterday afternoon Harry Shero was taken suddenly ill and dropped dead.

**DAVID SHIRREFFS  
DRAGGED TO DEATH  
UNDERNEATH DISC**

David Shirreffs, pioneer resident of the Valentine district, was killed at 11 o'clock this morning when the four-horse team he was driving on a disc ran away, dragging him about half a mile across the field.

The accident was seen from the house by his brother, W. D. Shirreffs, and also by Frank Bolton of KallsPELL, who happened to be passing. When they reached him, Mr. Shirreffs was dead. His body was badly cut and mangled by the disc.

He was working in the field across the road east of the house, but no one saw what started the team, which stopped of their own accord near the fence on the south side of the field. Coroner Campbell, who was called, said that Mr. Shirreffs' foot caught in a brace which ran from the body of the disc to the pole, which threw him underneath the implement, and made it impossible for him to escape.

Mr. Shirreffs was 56 years of age and unmarried. He has lived with his brother on the ranch at Valentine for many years, and has always taken a keen interest in public affairs. He has been a member of the Flathead County Fair association, and has always taken an active part in the affairs of that organization. He was well-known in the county, and has always been held in the highest respect and esteem.
