DROPS DEAD TODAY
AT POLEBRIDGE CAMP**

Chief Ranger Whiteraft of Glacier Park telephoned the sheriff's office today stating that Charles J. White had dropped dead at the CCC camp two miles north of Polebridge.

Coroner Campbell left at 11 a. m., but had not returned at the hour of going to press, so none of the details were learned.

Ranger Whiteraft said that the dead man was from Kalispell.

**HEART ATTACK FATAL
TO CHAS. J. WHITE**

Coroner Campbell returned late yesterday from the CCC camp at Polebridge with the body of Chas. J. White, whose death occurred yesterday morning about 7:45. He had been subject to a heart affliction for a number of years, and his death was undoubtedly due to this cause.

Fred Hinman, who had been working with Mr. White, and was with him at the time, said that death was almost instantaneous.

Besides his wife Mr. White is survived by a son and daughter. The family came here from Havre four years ago, and made their home near Creston.

The deceased was a member of the local carpenters' union.

Funeral services will be held Sunday afternoon at 2 o'clock at the Waggener and Campbell chapel by Rev. Harold Stark. The body will then be taken to Havre for burial.

The death of Charles J. White Friday was a great shock to the family and community. Mr. White was well known, working at his trade as carpenter. Funeral services were held in the Waggener & Campbell chapel Sunday. Rev. H. C. Stark conducted services. Philip and Charles Buck, Jr., sang two hymns. Many beautiful flowers were silent emblems of sympathy from many friends and neighbors. Following the services, the body was taken to Havre, where burial took place Wednesday afternoon. The deep sympathy of all is with the widow and children left to mourn the loss of a husband and father.

**FRED WHITESIDE DEAD;
FUNERAL TOMORROW**

Fred Whiteside, for many years a prominent resident of Flathead county, passed away yesterday afternoon at the Deaconess hospital at Great Falls.

The body is being shipped to Kalispell for burial, and will arrive here today. The funeral will be at the Waggener & Campbell chapel at 2:30 tomorrow (Wednesday) afternoon.

Mr. Whiteside was injured by a fall in the oil fields in Wyoming in January, 1934, from which he never recovered. Death was due to a paralytic stroke. He spent the summer here and was able to be up and about and enjoyed visiting with his old friends, but took a turn for the worse about a week ago. He was state senator from Flathead county for many years, and had large real estate holdings and business interests during his residence here. He left here about 20 years ago, and became interested in the oil fields of eastern Montana and Wyoming.

Mrs. Whiteside and her daughter, Mrs. McCutcheon, will arrive here this afternoon.
