Erik Bardo Amdahl was born June 17, 1870, in Selbu, Norway. He came to this country with his parents and two sisters, at the age of 12 years. Mr. Amdahl pioneered in Meeker county, in Minnesota. His parents died when he was 21 years of age. Shortly after, his married sister also passed away, and he undertook the care of her children.

Mr. Amdahl attended the winter school terms at Highland Park college in Des Moines, Iowa, and at Concordia college, in Moorhead, Minnesota.

On February 26, 1905, he was joined in marriage to Clara Martinson, of Ada, Minnesota. To them a daughter, Margaret, was born. For a time thereafter they lived in Colorado and California. In the fall of 1910 they moved to the Flathead valley, where his wife died December 8, 1914. On March 10, 1916 he was married to Emily Dahlgren, of Hector, Minnesota. A nephew, Carl Dahlgren, made his home with them for six years.

Mr. Amdahl died very suddenly on the afternoon of December 11, 1935. He is survived by his wife and daughter of Kalspell; a sister, a nephew, and a niece in Norway.

The family have long been members of the First Presbyterian church of Kalspell and Mr. Amdahl was active as an elder of the church for some years. He was always a thinker and very active in matters of community life. His many friends will remember him as a man of complete uprightness of character.
