**HOWARD BLACHLEY  
DIES FROM BULLET  
WOUND IN HEART**

Howard Blachley, Jr., only son of Mr. and Mrs. Howard Blachley, died this morning from a gunshot wound through the heart at the home of his parents, 1004 First avenue west.

He went to the bathroom at 7:45, and soon afterward a shot was heard. The family were unable to open the door and George Bryan, a neighbor, was called, and effected an entrance by removing a window. He found the unfortunate young man had been shot through the heart with a .22 caliber rifle, and had fallen against the door so that it was impossible to open it from the outside. A physician was summoned, and was of the opinion that death had been almost instantaneous. No reason is known why he should have taken his own life, and his parents are of the opinion that he brought the rifle down with him intending to go gopher hunting, and in some unknown manner accidentally shot himself.

An investigation was made by Raymond Waggener, Judge McCarty, acting coroner; Sheriff McMillan and Deputy Carr, and it was decided that no inquest was necessary.

He was 26 years of age and unmarried.

No funeral arrangements have been made as yet.

The many friends of the Howard Blachley and Waller Rau families were shocked and saddened at hearing of the death of "Sonny" Blachley, who died in Kalispell Saturday as the result of a gunshot wound, which was sustained when the gun accidentally discharged. Among the neighbors from this community who attended his funeral were: Mr. and Mrs. Kenneth Jackson, Mr. and Mrs. Ed Heinrich, Mrs. Jess Sipa and Melvin Mast. Everyone extends sympathy to the bereaved parents and sister.

Ephrata, Wash., May 30.—(AP)—Harry Buck, Seattle, was instantly killed and Harry Deals, Seattle, critically injured last night when the automobiles in which they were driving crashed into the rear of a truck in a three-way accident. J. W. Weimer, Renton, Wash., driver of the truck was held pending investigation.

A message was received today by the Elks lodge stating that Harry H. Buck, well known Kalispell man, had been killed in an automobile accident. No details of the accident were given, and the message asked that the family be notified.

Mr. Buck was a former member of the state legislature, and served several terms on the Kalispell city council. He located in Seattle about six months ago.
