Peter Coniff, aged 80, passed away yesterday afternoon at the hospital after a brief illness.

Mr. Coniff had been a resident of Pleasant Valley for the past 44 years and was well known in Kalspell. The body is at the Kalspell Funeral home. Funeral services will be held Friday morning at 10 o'clock in St. Matthew's church, Rev. Father O'Farrell officiating. Interment will be in Conrad Memorial cemetery.

The community was saddened Tuesday evening, on hearing of the passing of Peter Coniff of Pleasant Valley, at the Kalspell hospital. Tuesday afternoon, Mr. Coniff had been sick only a couple of weeks and succumbed to a heart ailment. He was 81 years of age and had lived in Pleasant Valley on his ranch here for 42 years. Mr. Coniff before coming here had worked in the mines at Butte and Phillipsburg, coming to Montana from Minneapolis where he was a liveried coachman for the Crosby family of the Crosby Flour Mills company. He was born in Ireland and came to New York, when a young man of 20 and spent several years there before coming west to Chicago and Minneapolis. He never married. Mr. Coniff was a man of very upright ideas and his extreme, conscientious honesty was a characteristic for which he was well known. Always a most generous and hospitable neighbor, he will long be remembered and missed by all who knew him. He is survived by a nephew, Patrick Fohay of Phillipsburg and possibly others not known to his friends here.
