**ALBERT EGGUM DIES
SUDDENLY AT BIGFORK**

Coroner Campbell and Sheriff McMillan were called to Bigfork Saturday to investigate the death of Albert Eggum, but decided that death was due to natural causes and that no inquest would be necessary.

Eggum, who was a man about 60, had been in poor health for some time, and had refused medical aid. Neighbors had called on him frequently, and visited him about 9:30 Saturday morning. They returned late Saturday afternoon and found him dead.

He came here about six months ago from Chinook and was living alone. So far as is known he has no relatives in this state. He had been in ill health for some time, and had apparently been trying to cure himself. The officers found a large quantity of literature pertaining to patent medicines in his cabin.

A friend in Chinook has been notified, and will come here to make funeral arrangements.

**LESTER ESLICK
LOSES HIS LIFE
IN LAKE BLAINE**

Lester Eslick, aged 18, of Creston, was drowned about 5 o'clock yesterday afternoon at the resort on the east shore of Lake Blaine.

The body was accidentally found by Warren Sparling, who had been in swimming there and while diving off the float saw the body lying on the bottom. Sparling immediately called two companions and they dragged the body to shore.

Dr. Burns was called but his attention; and the aid of oxygen and a resuscitator failed to revive the lad.

After examination, it was concluded by Acting Coroner Ray Waggener that Eslick had died of over-exertion. Jesse Adams, who operated the resuscitator, said no water came from the boy's lungs. It was reported that shortly before the body was found young Eslick had been chinning himself and doing other strenuous tricks on a horizontal bar. No one at the place recalled seeing a commotion or hearing any one call for help.

He was the son of Paul Eslick, and lived two and a half miles south of Creston.

Funeral services will be held on Tuesday afternoon at 2 o'clock at the Holt chapel. Burial will be made in Holt cemetery under the direction of Waggener & Campbell.

The Holt community was shocked on Sunday evening at the news of Lester Eslick's death by drowning. Lester had attended Sunday school that morning and had gone to Lake Blaine for a swim. Friends extend sympathy to the family and relatives. Funeral services were held at Holt church Tuesday afternoon.
