**KALISPELL MAN DIES
WHEN SLIDE CRUSHES
CAB OF ROAD SHOVEL**

Anaconda, Mont., Jan. 3.—(AP)—R. D. Hancock, 34, of Kalispell, died last night after 25 volunteer workers worked four hours to release him from the cab of a highway shovel he was operating, when a rock slide had crushed in the sides of the cab and pinned his legs motionless.

The slide of shale and boulders occurred on the Flint Creek hill highway, 26 miles west of Anaconda. A flagman who saw Hancock's plight rushed to Philipsburg and gathered a crew to help in the rescue attempt.

Hancock talked freely with the men who were trying to free him from the cab during the first hour then became unconscious.

A physician, Dr. L. P. Martin of Philipsburg, was at Hancock's side all the time, administering drugs in an attempt to relieve the man's suffering. After he died his body was removed and taken to Philipsburg. Dr. Martin said Hancock died because of the loss of blood.

The workers were cutting away the iron cab sides with electric torches. It was considered inadvisable to remove the heavy boulders, because of the danger of another and greater slide.

Hancock had resided in Philipsburg only a short time. He is survived by his mother, a resident of Kalispell.

The body is being brought to the Waggener & Campbell chapel at Kalispell and service arrangements are incomplete.

E. M. HUTCHINSON EXPIRES SUDDENLY AT HIS HOME TODAY

E. M. Hutchinson of Whitefish passed away suddenly at noon today, death being due to angina pectoris.

It was not known that Mr. Hutchinson was suffering with any heart ailment, and until today he had been in his usual health. Early this morning he complained of not feeling well and laid down on a sofa. About noon he suffered an acute attack, and passed away before medical aid could be summoned. It is believed that his death may have been due to unusual exertion, as he did considerable work about the house yesterday, removing snow from the walks, and last night attended the annual election of the Whitefish Masonic lodge.

Mr. Hutchinson was prominent in Masonic affairs, not only in Whitefish, but in the state, and was a Past Grand Master of the Masonic lodge in Montana.

He was the first superintendent of schools in Whitefish; was for many years connected with the Hutchinson Lumber company; served as postmaster of Whitefish for eight years, and always took an active part in civic affairs.
