WHITEFISH GIRL DIES SUDDENLY IN KALISPELL

Miss Oma McGahen of Whitefish dropped dead this afternoon at the home of Mrs. Lucile Cameron, 243 Third avenue west, Kalispell, where she was visiting.

The cause of death was not determined, but Coroner Campbell was informed that she had taken some medicine a short time before she was stricken.

She was a telephone operator at Whitefish.

The body is at the Waggener & Campbell mortuary and no funeral arrangements have been made as yet.

NO AUTOPSY TO BE HELD IN DEATH OF WHITEFISH GIRL

It has been decided that no autopsy to discover the cause of death of Miss Oma McGahen of Whitefish, who died suddenly here Monday afternoon, will be necessary, as there are no indications of either suicide or foul play.

Coroner Campbell learned that she went to the J. C. Penney store to make some purchases about 1 p. m., Monday, and employes said that she appeared entirely normal. From there she evidently went to the home of Mrs. Lucile Cameron, who was a school mate in Whitefish some years ago. Mrs. Cameron states that she appeared normal when she arrived, except that she was very pale. She laughed and joked with several who were in the house, but after a time put her hand to her chest and complained of a strange feeling. She said she had not been feeling well for some time and had been taking considerable medicine, and slumped down, unconscious. A physician was called, but life was extinct when he arrived and death had apparently been instantaneous. She took no medicine while at the Cameron home.

Her father, C. W. McGahen, was in Kalispell today, and said that she had not been in the best of health for some time, but that her condition was not considered serious. While helping her mother about the house a few days ago she was taken suddenly ill, was very pale and short of breath.

The funeral will be held at 2:30 Thursday afternoon at the Presbyterian church in Whitefish.

POLSON CORONER'S JURY FINDS MILES DIED BY OWN HAND

Polson, Aug. 13.—(P)—The fatal shooting of a rancher during a "lovers' quarrel" in which he wounded a 21-year-old girl who refused to go for a walk with him was listed in the Lake county coroner's records today as a suicide.

After hearing the tearful story of the girl, Lucille Ducharme, at an inquest last night, a jury returned a verdict to Coroner John Dimon that Robert Miles, 30, had shot himself to death.

Recovered from a superficial bul-

let wound that creased her head. Miss Ducharme told the jury how Miles called Tuesday evening at the ranch of her grandmother, Mrs. Lucy Ducharme, urged her to take a walk with him, and then shot her when she refused.

Hearing the shots, farmers ran from a nearby field and found Miss Ducharme, wounded, in her grandmother's home. Miles was lying outside, shot in the head. He died as the farmers reached him.

Sheriff J. L. Taulbee, Undersheriff Lee Butcher, the coroner and others who investigated the shooting testified at the inquest.
