POLSON WOMAN KILLED, 3 HURT IN HIGHWAY CRASH

Polson, Mont., Aug. 22. — (AP) — One woman was killed, her husband was seriously hurt and another couple suffered injuries that may be fatal in an early-morning highway smashup south of Ravalli today.

Mrs. Alfred Pronovost, 21, of Polson, apparently was killed instantly. Her husband and Mr. and Mrs. Hardy Thomas, also of Polson, were found unconscious in the wreckage of an automobile about 3 a. m. at a point about a mile and a half south of Ravalli.

Sheriff J. L. Taulbee and Dr. John Diamond, Lake county coroner, said G. H. Beckwith, of St. Ignatius, discovered the wrecked car, which had overturned several times at a point where the highway is covered with loose gravel.

Mr. and Mrs. Thomas were taken to a hospital at St. Ignatius. It was reported their injuries might prove fatal. They still were unconscious several hours after the wreck as was Pronovost.

Thomas and Pronovost are employees of the Montana Power Co. at Polson dam. They were driving from Polson to Missoula when their auto was wrecked.

The sheriff and coroner said the car apparently got out of control in the loose gravel.
