MRS. ALICE YATES

Mrs. Alice Walker Yates passed away last night at her home at 117 Third avenue east in Kalispell. Mrs. Yates was 69 years of age and was as well as usual when she suffered a cerebral hemorrhage and passed away in a few minutes. The Yates family came here in 1908. Funeral services will be held Wednesday afternoon at 3:30 at the Waggener and Campbell chapel by Rev. Walter H. Sandy followed by interment in the Conrad Memorial cemetery. Mrs. Yates was a member of The War Mothers and the Royal Neighbors.

The community was shocked and saddened to hear of the passing of Mrs. Alice W. Yates Monday, January 13, at her home in Kalispell. Mr. and Mrs. Yates came to the Flathead valley more than 20 years ago, with the opening of the reservation. They homesteaded in the Big Draw and conducted the store and postoffice at Eudora. Later they lived at Elmo and Big Arm for several years before moving to Kalispell to make their home. She was a kind neighbor and a loving mother in her home and made hosts of friends who will mourn her death.

**MRS. ELSIE YEATS
EXPIRES SUDDENLY
AT CEMETERY TODAY**

A tragedy occurred at the Memorial Day service this morning when Mrs. Elsie Yeats suddenly succumbed to a heart attack.

Mrs. Yeats had for many years been making her home with her brother, W. D. Shirreffs, at Valentine and this morning they drove to Kalispell to attend the Memorial Day exercises. When they arrived Mrs. Yeats was not feeling well and decided to remain in the car while her brother witnessed the ceremony. When he returned she was ill, and although Dr. Keil, who was in the audience, was called, nothing could be done for her, and she passed away in a few moments.

Mrs. Yeats was 76 years of age, and beside her brother is survived by a son and grandchild in eastern Montana.

Funeral services will be held Tuesday at 2 o'clock at the Waggener & Campbell chapel, Rev. Richard Price of the Whitefish Episcopal church officiating. Interment will be in the Conrad Memorial cemetery.
