Obituary

Anders Marius Anderson was born March 12, 1879 in Odense, Denmark, and as a young man came to the United States and settled in eastern Montana, where he acquired large ranch holdings and was also interested in banking at Sidney. In 1920 Mr. Anderson came to Kalispell. He built the Liberty Theatre and was active in local civic affairs until his retirement on account of failing health several years ago. Mr. and Mrs. Anderson recently went to Seattle for Mr. Anderson's health and he passed away there May 23, at the age of 57 years. He was a member of the Danish Brotherhood of America.

Those surviving are his wife, Mrs. Anne Anderson; three sons, Carl E., Sophus C., and Melvin Anderson, all of Kalispell; and two daughters, Mrs. Arthur Burch of Kalispell, and Mrs. Ellis Brower of Roman.

Obituary

Charles D. Atteberry passed away Sunday, January 6, 1936, at his home on Sixth avenue west north in Kalispell. He was 74 years of age. Mr. Atteberry was born at Peoria, Illinois, April 15, 1860 and was married in 1881 to Miss Ida Louk. They traveled by covered wagon to Kansas and later the same way to Anaconda, Montana. One year later, in 1882, they again moved by covered wagon and came to the Flathead, being among the first 18 land settlers, their original pre-emption now being a part of the east side of Kalispell.

A few years later they moved to the Helena Flats district where they farmed. Mrs. Atteberry passed away

there in 1922. In 1923 Mr. Atteberry was married to Mrs. Sarah C. Von Presentino and in 1929 they retired from the farm and made their home in Kalispell. Mr. Atteberry is survived by his widow at home and two sons, John C. Atteberry, Route 1, Kalispell, and George C. Atteberry, Grants Pass, Oregon, also five grandchildren and one great grandchild.
