**MAN KILLED AS
CRANE GOES OVER
LOGAN PASS ROAD**

Lloyd Campbell, 34, Missoula, died yesterday afternoon in an ambulance which was bringing him to the hospital here as the result of injuries which he received when the truck crane which he was operating on the Logan Pass highway in Glacier park crashed over the embankment of the road.

He suffered a fractured skull, crushed chest, broken collar bone and internal injuries.

The accident occurred about 2:30 o'clock as he was maneuvering the huge machine around on the road and approached too close to the edge of the road, precipitating the truck and crane about 10 feet down the mountainside.

Witnesses to the accident stated that Campbell attempted to escape from the cab of the truck and was caught beneath the machine as it turned over on its side. Two men, Albert Piigh and Joe Barber, occupying the cab of the crane were uninjured.

Campbell was taken 20 miles to Apgar by truck and placed in a CCC ambulance there and was being brought to Kallispell when he succumbed to his injuries.

He was a CCC foreman at one of the Glacier park camps and had been living at Apgar for the past few months.

ROYAL M. COOK TAKES OWN LIFE BY AUTO FUMES

Royal M. Cook, 44, was found lying dead beneath his car near the steel bridge yesterday morning. Coroner Campbell attributed his death to asphyxiation from carbon monoxide from the exhaust of the automobile and pronounced it a clear case of suicide.

Cook's body was discovered by E. S. Mark, weather observer, about 100 feet from the highway in the wooded area near the western approach to the bridge. He was lying partially under the car and had a blanket wrapped around his head and a section of it about the exhaust.

The machine had run out of gas and the battery was low. Authorities believed that he had been dead for at least 24 hours.

Mr. Mark, who had been fishing in the Flathead river Saturday, stated that he observed the man lying there late in the afternoon, but had thought that it was someone who had probably gone to sleep.

However, when he saw him still lying there Sunday morning in identically the same position he investigated and found that he was dead. He notified the sheriff's office.

Mrs. Cook said that she had not seen her husband since Friday morning when he left for work, so it is believed that he may have committed suicide sometime Friday night. Mr. Mark stated that he first
