AGED WOODCUTTER IS FOUND DEAD

Andrew Danielson, aged 69, a woodcutter, was found dead about 1:30 o'clock Saturday afternoon about eight miles northwest of Kalispell with a bullet wound through his heart. He had been shot, probably accidentally, through the left chest with a .33 special rifle.

He was found by his brother, Axel Danielson, for whom he was working, when the latter went to the dead man's cabin to secure a load of wood. Danielson was cutting wood on the A. R. Douglas timber property.

The coroner's office stated that he had probably been shot Friday morning, as the body was badly decomposed when it was discovered, indicating that it had lain under the heating rays of the hot sun for at least 36 hours. The body was found face downward on the ground under a large spruce tree with the gun, in which one discharged cartridge was found, lying by his side.

Axel Danielson stated that his brother was probably sitting under the tree waiting for game, when often graze on a meadow adjoining the timber, when he was killed by the discharge of the rifle.

Danielson was in Kalispell July 4 and 5 and was seen here again last Wednesday. It was reported that he had been drinking some, which gave rise to the possible belief that he may have committed suicide.

No inquest will be held. Coroner Campbell said. Funeral services will be held this afternoon at 4 o'clock from the Waggener & Campbell chapel, with burial in the Conrad Memorial cemetery.
