Mrs. Elliott left here last Tuesday for the Mayo clinic for treatment for a swelling which had recently appeared on her back. She was suffering no pain, and her condition was not considered at all critical. Mr. Elliott therefore left for Billings, where he expected to spend a day or two with his son, Howard, and then join Mrs. Elliott in Rochester. He had no intimation of the seriousness of her illness until he received the shocking news of her death last night.

Howard Elliott immediately left Billings by plane to return with the body, and Mr. Elliott is returning home today via Missoula, where he will be joined by Miss Helen Elliott, who is employed in the office of the registrar of the State University.

Mrs. Elliott has been a resident of Kalispell for over 30 years, and has a wide circle of friends who will greatly regret her passing.
