# KALISPELL BOY IS DRAGGED TO DEATH BY HORSE

**Roger Sherman, 14, Succumbs  
To Injuries Received When  
Thrown From Animal And  
Dragged For More Than  
Two Blocks**

Roger Sherman, 14-year-old son of Mr. and Mrs. John Sherman of this city, died at the Sisters' hospital shortly after noon today from injuries received when he was dragged at the end of a lariat rope, for a distance of more than two blocks, by a run-away horse, from which he had been thrown when the animal became frightened by dogs.

The tragedy occurred about 10:40 o'clock this morning on Third avenue east. His arm was caught in the running noose of the lariat when he was pitched to the ground as the horse reared, frightened at the barking of the dogs.

An eye witness, Robert L. Crosskrey, 1017 Third avenue east, stated that the boy was dragged from near the Sherman residence south to Ninth street, and then down the alley and to Tenth street, where the horse was stopped by Ray Hosford, Kalispell Mercantile delivery man in the rear of the Thomas Quinby home.

Mr. Hosford cut the rope from the horse and rushed the boy to the hospital, where he died without regaining consciousness.

He sustained a fracture of the skull, which physicians considered hopeless on examination.

The boy was riding bareback with only a hackamore, to which the lariat was attached.
