DEATH OF TRESCH DUE TO DROWNING, CORONER DECIDES

The decision of Coroner Campbell this morning was that Joseph Treach who was drowned while on a fishing trip in the North Fork Sunday, came to his death as a result of drowning, rather than a pre-supposed assumption that he had suffered a heart attack while wading the stream. Pronouncement of the cause of his death came after a careful examination had been made.

Treech's body was found yesterday forenoon by Sheriff C. A. Robinson and those assisting him, in a deep hole about 26 yards below the point where he had been seen to collapso and disappear in the swift current.

It was determined that the water

where Mr. Tresch had been wading was about three feet deep and very rapid. He was undoubtedly swept from his feet and was unable to recover himself, Coroner Campbell said.
