THREE FLATHEAD **RESIDENTS MEET VIOLENT DEATHS**

John S. Bessent Killed In Auto Crash - Robert Wiar Takes Own Life — Whitefish Man Found Dead At Essex

Three persons were killed in this section of the state over the week-end as tragedy stalked through northwestern Montana in a variety of forms.

John S. Bessent, 51, automobile salesman for the Garey Motor com-

pany, was instantly killed near Lake-side about 5 o'clock Sunday morning when his car somersaulted more than 50 feet down the embankment after he had apparently gone to sleep at the wheel of his machine.

Robert Lee Wiar, 42, a World war veteran, was discovered hanging from a rafter in his garage at his home at 372 Seventh avenue east north, about 1 o'clock Sunday morning by his wife, Emma. Wiar had tied one end of the rope about his neck and had leaped off the hood of his car. Death, it was stated, occurred almost instantly, probably between 6 and 7 o'clock thatevening.

Wiar, it was stated, had been suf-fering il health for some time and this was given as the probable cause for taking his own life.
