SELF - INFLICTED GUNSHOT WOUNDS FATAL TO CALDER

Pete Calder, 54, succumbed last evening at the Sisters' hospital from a self-inflicted gun shot wound. He was discovered about 2:20 o'clock yesterday afternoon in a cabin on the north side in a dying condition.

Hospital attendants held out little hope for his recovery from the start, as the bullet from a .22 calibre rifle had penetrated his forehead.

So far as is known he had no relatives here and had been living alone in the tourist cabin. Acquaintances stated that he had been ill for some time and it is believed that ill health influenced his decision to take his own life.

**MISS EMMA CHESTER

BY BROTHER TODAY**

Miss Emma Chester was found dead in bed by her brother, J. H. Chester, when he returned home for lunch at noon today. Dr. A. T. Munro, who lives across the street, was called, and gave as his opinion that death was due to an attack of acute indigestion which affected her heart.

Although she had not been feeling well, Miss Chester had been about as usual, and her condition was not considered serious. Coroner Campbell is of the opinion that death occurred some time during the morning after Mr. Chester had left for the office.

She has been a resident of KallsPELL or the past 36 years, and during a greater part of that time has made her home with J. H. Chester.

She is survived by three brothers, J. H. and T. E. Chester, both of KallsPELL, and Will Chester, of London, England, and three sisters, Mrs. Ward Benson of Long Beach, Calif., and Mrs. Will Patterson and Mrs. Denim, both of Detroit.

BIGFORK BOY DIES AS RESULT OF SHOT FIRED BY OFFICER

Deland Conant, the Bigfork boy who was shot Thursday night during an alleged burglary of the Horn & Smith store, died of his injuries this afternoon at 2 o'clock at the county hospital.

It is said that the Conant boy, accompanied by two others, had entered the store, and refused to halt when called upon to do so by Harry Ratchford and Kenneth Paul, who had been deputized to watch the building.

The watchmen then fired, one of the shots striking young Conant in the abdomen. The other two boys surrendered, and were turned over to Juvenile Officer M. R. Wood.

Young Conant was 15 and the other two boys were 16.

Coroner Campbell announced today that an inquest will be held, probably at Bigfork tomorrow.

G. T. CRAVEN OF SOMERS SHOOTS SELF TO DEATH

Glen T. Craven, 51, shot and killed himself about 6:30 o'clock last evening in front of his home at Somers while sitting in his car with his wife, daughter and son. Coroner Campbell, who was called immediately stated that the death was clearly suicidal.

Mr. and Mrs. Craven and their daughter had just returned from Wolf creek, where they had gone to bring back a hunting party composed of their son and two other young men. On the way back to Kalispell Craven had been acting queerly, it was stated, giving the contents of his pockets and a ring to his daughter. Shortly after the car had stopped in front of his home, Craven placed the muzzle of a rifle he was holding to his head and fired. He died instantly.

It is understood that he has been suffering from a nervous mental disorder since last July.

Mr. Craven was foreman of the Somers Lumber company planing mill. He had lived in Somers for 19 years and is survived by his widow, two sons and two daughters.
