**A. J. DEAN DIES AT
PORTLAND, OREGON**

Many Kalispell friends were shocked to hear of the sudden death of A. J. Dean yesterday morning in Portland, where he had gone several weeks ago for medical treatment. His death came from a heart attack suffered about 10:30 yesterday morning at the hotel where he was staying.

Mr. Dean established the J. C. Penney store in Kalispell in 1914 and remained as manager of the firm for about 15 years. He made many friends in the city during his residence here, and always took an active part in civic affairs and was keenly interested in this community.

The body is being brought to Kalispell by his son, Edwin Dean, who left immediately for Portland yesterday upon receipt of the telegram announcing his passing.

Funeral arrangements are incomplete awaiting arrival of relatives and will be announced later by Waggener & Campbell.
