RAY ZELLER DIES IN TRUCK MISHAP

Libby, Mar. 24.—(AP)—Two men, Ray Zeller, 55, of Eureka, and Oscar Gray, 60, of Trogo, were injured fatally when a light truck in which they were riding crashed into a bridge railing near here today.

The truck struck a side railing on the bridge over the Kootenai river, bounded across the highway, plunged through the guard rail and fell 25 feet to the rocks below.

Both men were trapped under the wrecked vehicle.

Their deaths increased to 23 the number of traffic fatalities in Montana this year.
