Mrs. Hand has been in ill health for more than a year, and last December she and Mr. Hand went to California to spend the winter with their daughter, Mrs. Helene Whitehead. Her condition was fairly good when she left here, but while the news of her death came as a shock to her many friends, it was not wholly unexpected, as there had been frequent reports that she had been failing rapidly during the winter. Her death occurred at the home of her daughter at Los Angeles, where she had been staying.

In addition to Mr. Hand, she is survived by her daughter, Mrs. Whitehead; her son, Roger Hand, and a sister, Mrs. Dora Rogers of Seattle.

Mr. Hand, Mrs. Whitehead and Roger Hand are accompanying the body which will arrive here Sunday.
