POLSON MAN DROWNED; BODY NOT RECOVERED

At a late hour Wednesday night the body of Olaf Karlsgodt, prominent Polson merchant who lost his life while on a fishing trip Tuesday afternoon on Flathead lake, was yet unrecovered.

Crews have been working with grappling irons and drag nets continuously but have failed so far to find any evidence of the body.

The death of Mr. Karlsgodt, believed to have been caused from a heart ailment, came as a great surprise and shock to the entire community.

Mr. Karlsgodt, accompanied by his brother-in-law, John Horall, a police captain at Los Angeles, who has been visiting here at the Karlsgodt home, and Lloyd Harris, left here Tuesday morning to enjoy a day's fishing on the lake, near Rollins.

The party had lunch at the Painted Rocks and from there started out in their boat for the center of the lake. They were fishing about a mile from shore, between Cedar and Wild Horse islands, when suddenly Mr. Karlsgodt rose from his seat in the center of the boat and toppled over the side. Mr. Horall who was running the motor, quickly turned it off and dived in after Mr. Karlsgodt. The body sank so fast that Mr. Horall was unable to reach it. Both men made several dives, but were unsuccessful in finding the body. (Flathead Courier).

SERVICES FOR OLAF KARLSGODT WILL BE HELD NEXT SUNDAY

Services will be held next Sunday afternoon at 1:30 o'clock in the Masonic temple, in memory of Olaf Karlsgodt, prominent Polson merchant, who lost his life while on a fishing trip on Flathead lake two weeks ago.

The services will be in charge of the Polson Masonic lodge, of which Mr. Karlsgodt was a member. Special music will be furnished by the Lutheran Girls' chorus and Mrs. E. S. Ede.

Following these services, last rites will be conducted by the lodge members on the lake shore near Rollins at which time wreaths will be placed on the water in his memory.

Mr. Karlsgodt lost his life while fishing near Rollins, August 30. He was accompanied by his brother-in-law, John Horall of Los Angeles, and Lloyd Harris of Polson.

It is believed that he suffered from a heart attack as he suddenly toppled over the side of the boat and disappeared into the lake.

Every effort possible was made to recover the body but the efforts were of no avail.—The Flathead Courier.
