EARL LYGHT DIES IN GUN ACCIDENT

While putting his gun away after a hunting trip yesterday, Earl Lyght, 29, of Kalispell, was instantly killed when his gun was accidentally discharged. The accident occurred at the Sam Connors logging camp near Brown's Meadows about 6:45 p. m.

Lyght had returned from his trip and was putting the gun in its usual place under the rafters of a low barn. Evidently putting the stock up first, the hammer caught when he attempted to put the gun in place. He was shot through the neck and died almost instantly. With him at the time of the accident were C. Z. and Art Redfield.

He was the son of Mr. and Mrs. John D. Lyght of Kalispell.

Coroner Campbell was called and upon learning the facts decided no inquest was necessary.
