**ALEC M. CAMERON**

Funeral services for the late Alec M. Cameron, former adjutant at the State Soldiers' Home, took place Sunday at Butte under the auspices of the Butte camp of the United Spanish War Veterans, its auxiliary and the Masonic lodge.

Mr. Cameron passed away at the Veterans hospital in Portland, Oregon, October 19, from the effects of a gunshot wound which he received in July, 1898, in the charge by American forces on San Juan Hill during the Spanish-American war. The wound received by Mr. Cameron has been causing him trouble for many years.

Special services were held by the U. S. W. V. Auxiliary Sunday evening and the U. S. W. V. band military service at the grave. Attending services also was the Butte Miners' band, of which Mr. Cameron was a life-long member. He was also a past department commander of the U. S. W. V.

Burial was in the Veterans' plot at the Butte cemetery.

**MRS. WILL CAVE**

Mrs. Will Cave, aged 68, of Missoula died in a Missoula hospital Monday afternoon after a short illness.

Mrs. Cave was born in Salt Lake City, Utah, 1871. She came to this Flathead with her parents, Mr. and Mrs. D. J. Plume in about 1885 and Mr. Plume established the first drug store in the Flathead at Ashley.

Following her marriage Mrs. Cave had resided in Missoula for the past 31 years, where she was prominent in Democratic political affairs in western Montana. She was an honorary member of the Montana Pioneers and also was affiliated with the Episcopal church and the Macabees, an organization which has been absorbed by the W.B.A. Mr. Cave is a past president of the Montana Society of Pioneers and is one of the best known, old-time natives of the state.

Besides her husband the survivors include a daughter, Mrs. Clara Kuhl and a granddaughter, Clara Lou Kuhl, both of Eau Claire, Wis.

Funeral services will be conducted Wednesday afternoon at 2 o'clock in the Church of the Holy Spirit in Missoula by the Rev. Thomas W. Bennett. Interment will be made in the Missoula cemetery.

## Thomas Chester, Pioneer Merchant Claimed by Death

Thomas E. Chester, aged 70 years, pioneer resident and merchant of Kalispell, died early this morning at his home on First avenue east from a heart attack. The community was shocked to learn of his death.

Mr. Chester had been suffering from a heart ailment since September 10 and had been under the care of a physician since that time. Yesterday, however, he was able to get up and around, attending a motion picture show in the evening and was apparently feeling well when he retired.

He came to Kalispell 40 years ago as an employe of the Great Northern Railway company. He was cashier and later agent of the local office. Mr. Chester was employed for seven years by the Missoula Mercantile company as traffic manager and then entered business himself, operating Chester's Book Store for the past 22 years.

Mr. Chester is survived by his widow, Mrs. Effie Chester, a son, Elliot Chester, and a brother, J. H. Chester, all of Kalispell; a daughter, Mrs. W. R. Olney of Missoula; three sisters, Mrs. Ward Benson of Long Beach, California, Mrs. Guy Deuham, Theford, Ontario, and Mrs. Will Patterson of Detroit, Michigan; also a brother, W. G. Chester, of London, England. He was born at Theford, Ontario, September 10, 1869.

Funeral services will be held Wednesday afternoon at 2 o'clock from the Waggener & Campbell chapel, with Rev. H. D. Ricketts officiating. Burial will be made in the Conrad Memorial cemetery.
