Parents of the young man, Mr. and Mrs. Frank Feenan, told Coroner Harry Campbell, that he had been despondent for sometime because of unemployment and believed that to have been the contributing factor in his decision to take his own life.

Feenan was alone in an upstairs bedroom of his home when he shot himself. His parents and a brother rushed to his room and called Dr. W. L. Kell, who administered emergency treatment. The shot was heard about 2 o'clock and he died shortly after 5 p. m.
