Frank Feenan passed away early Friday morning at his farm home west of Columbia Falls, where he had lived nearly 30 years. Mr. Feenan was 66 years of age. Columbia Falls Man
Takes His Own Life:**

William Francis Feenan, aged 28 years, of Columbia Falls, died late yesterday afternoon at his home about three hours after he had shot himself through the head with a .22 calibre rifle. Parents of the young man, Mr. and Mrs. Frank Feenan, told Coroner Harry Campbell, that he had been despondent for some time because of unemployment and believed that to have been the contributing factor in his decision to take his own life.

Feenan was alone in an upstairs bedroom of his home when he shot himself. His parents and a brother rushed to his room and called Dr. W. L. Kell, who administered emergency treatment. The shot was heard about 2 o'clock and he died shortly after 5 p. m.

He is survived by his parents, four brothers, John, Fred, Thomas and Robert, and a sister, Mrs. Mary Cavanaugh, all of Columbia Falls.

The body is at the Waggener & Campbell Funeral home, and funeral arrangements are incomplete pending word from relatives in California.

**RONAN MAN KILLED
IN TRUCK ACCIDENT**

Hot Springs, Mont., Nov. 7.—(AP)—The death of William Fehlberg, about 37, a truck driver, increased Montana's highway accident fatality toll for the year to 127.

Fehlberg was killed instantly last night when he attempted to leap from his truck as it was turning over. He was pinned beneath the cab.

The soft shoulder of a spur road leading from the Plains-Elmo highway to Hot Springs gave way beneath the vehicle. Fehlberg was employed in construction improvement on Highway No. 28.

His widow and children, who reside at Ronan, survive.

ROBERT W. FLEMING

Robert W. Fleming, 59, former Flathead county deputy sheriff and general foreman of road construction in Glacier park since 1924, died at the veterans' hospital at Helena Saturday afternoon, following an illness of about five months.

The body was sent to Polson and he will be buried there Tuesday with military honors. The Masonic lodge will also officiate in the ceremony. Funeral service will be held at 3 o'clock, with Rev. M. A. Cookson officiating.

Mr. Fleming took a prominent part in the capture of Chester Powell of Lake county 18 years ago after the latter had killed his wife and then terrorized the lower Flathead district for four days before being brought to bay and shot by the posse of which Fleming was a member. Fleming lost his right arm in the exchange of gunfire between the desperado and members of the posse. The gun fight occurred October 11, 1921.

Mr. Fleming homesteaded at Polson in 1908 and was engaged in the freight hauling business for several years in the lower Flathead before moving to Kalispell in 1922. He was appointed general foreman of roads in the park in 1924.
