MRS. THOMAS GRIMES, FORMERLY MRS. MERRIFIELD DIES IN MINNESOTA

News was received here today of the death of Mrs. Thomas Grimes, formerly Mrs. A. W. Merrifield, a pioneer resident well known in this county. Mr. and Mrs. Merrifield lived for many years at Lakeside, and previously owned a large ranch in Pleasant Valley.

A Barnum, Minnesota newspaper gives the following account of her death:

"When Mrs. Thos. Grimes went to look for her dog on the farm of her brother, James Purcell of South Hull, Friday, she did not return. Becoming alarmed at her absence friends started a search for her. Her body was found nearby shortly afterward. She had apparently suffered a heart attack.

"Mrs. Grimes, who was in her 76th year, had been visiting at the home of her brother the past three weeks. She was born in South Hull, the daughter of the late Mr. and Mrs. Chas. Purcell. In 1887 she was married to A. W. Merrifield, a former U. S. marshal of Montana. He predeceased her by 10 years. Three years ago she was married to Thomas Grimes of South Hull.

Surviving, in addition to her husband, are two brothers, James of South Hull, William of Edmonton and a sister, Mrs. J. N. Hall of South Hull.

Funeral services were held at South Hull, where interment was made.

She was a charter member of the Eastern Star lodge in Kalispell and had many friends here.
