## JAS. JORGENSEN, SR. IS TAKEN BY DEATH

Scores of friends of James Jorgensen, Sr., pioneer resident of this section, were shocked today to learn of his death, which occurred about 4:30 this morning at his home, 644 First avenue east. He apparently succumbed to a heart attack.

From all appearances Mr. Jorgensen had been in good health and had talked and visited with many friends during the past week. He was 65 years of age.

Mr. Jorgensen first came to Flathead valley 47 years ago, later returning here to enter business at T. Palm, which he operated alone from 1904 to 1908, and then entering into partnership with Albert Dressen in operation of the establishment. Both men retired from active business two years ago when they sold their business to Ward McMillan.

He was born in Schlesvik-Holstien, Denmark, November 8, 1874, and came to America in 1887. He first settled in Chicago, but later moved to the Flathead, where he resided continuously up to his death.

Mr. Jorgensen is survived by his widow, two daughters, Helena and Margaret, and a son, James, Jr., all of Kalispell.

He was a member of the Odd Fellows lodge, Elks, Sons of Herman, Scandinavian Fraternity and the Knights of Pythias.

The body is at the Kalispell Funeral home and services will be conducted Thursday at 2 p. m. from the chapel, with Rev. M. A. Cookson officiating. Burial will be made in the Conrad Memorial cemetery. The Odd Fellows lodge will take part in the services, it was announced.
