**HERB KNOWLTON DIES

Killed with Knowlton in the plunge was a companion, Frank Gottlieb. Both died instantly, it is believed. Knowlton's body was pinned beneath the wreckage of the machine and Gottlieb had been thrown clear of the car before its plunge.

Knowlton was well known in Kalspell, having acted as manager of the Kelley dairy northwest of Kalspell for several years.

**DR. GEORGE KRAUSS**

Dr. George Krauss, who was resident physician for the Somers Lumber company during their operations at Swan Lake about 25 years ago, died at Philadelphia December 30. This information was contained in a letter from his son, George F. Krauss to E. J. O'Brien of Bigfork.

Dr. Krauss served in the World war, and enlisted at Kalispell. After his discharge he returned to Swan Lake for about six months, and then returned to his former practice in Pennsylvania. Since that time he has returned here for hunting trips on two different occasions, and will be remembered by some of the older residents.

A clipping from a Philadelphia newspaper says:

"Dr. George Kraus, a practicing physician for more than 42 years, died at his home last night at the age of 65 years. He began his practice in 1886 at the age of 22, following his graduation at Jefferson Medical college in Philadelphia. He also attended medical school at Muhlenberg college.

During the World war he served in the medical corps of the United States Army with the rank of lieutenant and was sent to Alaska during the influenza epidemic, serving there with distinction in spite of severe handicaps. For the past 18 years he had been practicing in Allentown, Pa., where he was on the hospital staff. He was an ardent sportsman and was fond of both fishing and hunting.

Besides his wife, he is survived by a son, George F. Krauss of Philadelphia; a granddaughter and a sis-
