**JOHN LISTLE DEAD**

John H. Listle, former well known Kalispell man, died yesterday at Santa Barbara, California, after a brief illness. This information was contained in a telegram from Mrs. Listle to T. C. Hand.

Mr. Listle was one of the pioneer residents, coming here in 1832 from Salt Lake City. He had previously been manager for restaurants for the Santa Fe Railroad in the south-

west. He started one of the first restaurants in Kalispell, and remained in that business until he left for California to make his home about 15 years ago.

Mr. Hand recalls that he, C. H. Foot and Mr. Listle came here together, making the trip from Missoula over the reservation by stage to the present site of Polson, and from there by steamer over the lake to Deerperville.
