**A. M. Moore is Claimed by Death**

A. M. Moore, one of the early settlers in this section of the state and a pioneer in the cattle and dude ranch industry of Montana, died early Wednesday evening at the Seattle General hospital following a major operation. He was 58 years of age.

Mr. Moore came to the Flathead with his father, Colonel J. W. R. Moore, in 1892, at the age of 13 years and became associated with his father in the cattle raising industry at an early age. Since his father's death in 1922, Mr. Moore established a dude ranch at his ranch home six miles south of Marion in the Pine Prairie district.

For several years Mr. Moore served as state cattle inspector and handled short-term government farm loans.

His body arrived this afternoon accompanied by Mrs. Moore and her sister, Miss Leila Bennett. Funeral arrangements have been tentatively set for 2 o'clock Sunday at the Episcopal church, Rev. M. A. Cookson officiating.

Mr. Moore was born at Mount Jackson, Virginia, November 20, 1882. His father was a member of the staff of General Robert E. Lee during the Civil war. He attended school in Kalspell and at Helena and married Miss Alene Bennett of Kalspell about a quarter of a century ago.

Surviving are his widow, a brother Charles of Kalspell and a sister living in Texas.
