**Boy, Age 3, Killed  
In An Automobile  
Mishap Near Elmo**

**William F. Sims, Son of Mr. and Mrs. C. W. Sims of Shelby, is Victim When Car Overturns on Highway**

William Francis Sims, 3-year-old son of Mr. and Mrs. C. W. Sims of Shelby, was instantly killed early last evening when the car in which he was riding overturned on the highway 12 miles west of Elmo. As the car overturned the door of the machine opened and the child, sleeping in the back seat, was caught in the doorway when the machine crashed on its side, fracturing his skull.

Mrs. Sims, who was driving, and Mrs. Louise Murphy of Elmo, and a second child, Danny, were returning from Polson to Hot Springs when the accident occurred. According to a report from the State Highway

Patrol, the car swerved to the left side of the road when it struck loose gravel.

Mrs. Murphy went to the Paul Foot farm nearby for aid and Mr. Foot brought the party into Katiapell. Suffering from shock, Mrs. Sims was taken to the Sisters' hospital on her arrival.

Assisting Mr. Foot in righting the overturned car were Martin and Francis Nichols and Stewart Collins, also of Narada. The accident occurred about 6:45 o'clock last evening.

The child's body will be taken to Shelby this afternoon, where funeral services will be held. It is now at the Sherman-Owen Funeral home.

**Hunt for Body of M. Smith Abandoned**

Search for the body of Milo Smith, who was reportedly drowned yesterday in the Flathead river near the Soldiers' Home when his boat capsized, has been abandoned in view of the improbability of recovering the body during present high water conditions, officers said this afternoon. Persons living near the river, however, have been asked to watch for the body in case it should have drifted into some eddy or log jam.

Yesterday a large searching party under the direction of Commandant C. W. McConnell at the Soldiers' Home and Sheriff C. A. Robinson combed the shore of the river for several miles below where the drowning took place. One party made a careful search of an island opposite where Smith was fishing in the belief the body may have become lodged in willows along the water's edge.

Several persons fishing along the river at the time heard Smith yell when his boat capsized and one person reported that he had seen the body rise once from the water. A rescue party was organized immediately at the Soldiers' Home.

Smith was admitted to the Soldiers' Home in 1930 from Great Falls and has lived there continuously since. He is survived by a sister, Mrs. Clara Roe of Jacksonville, Florida. He was a World war veteran.
