Bozeman, Mont., Aug. 15.—(15)—Funeral services are being arranged for J. E. Thompson, 71, who died suddenly yesterday in a grain field at the home of a brother, Charles Thompson, near Belgrade.

Thompson, a resident of Kalispell, and the Flathead lake area for 53 years, had been visiting his brother. A son in Kalispell, a foster daughter in Los Angeles, and six brothers and four sisters survive.
