Christian Anderson was born in Denmark, on November 9, 1871. He came to the United States as a young man, living in Michigan for a number of years, where he was married to Miss Marie Anderson. **REV. FATHER HENRY ARTS**

Funeral services were held in Helena yesterday for the Rev. Father Henry Arts, 75, who passed away in Seattle. Rev. P. X. O'Farrell, dean of the Kalispell area, and Rev. J. P. O'Shea of Whitefish were in attendance.

Rev. Father Arts was born in Holland, October 6, 1865, and ordained to the priesthood in 1890. He came to Montana in 1894 and served as assistant priest at Helena and Butte until appointed pastor of St. Matthew's parish in Kalispell in 1903. He served here until 1906, when Rev. O'Farrell came to take charge, Rev. Arts then being sent to Townsend. He later served for a time at Whitefish and for many years was connected with the Sisters' hospital in Kalispell, before leaving for the coast.

By a will admitted to probate in Helena December 12, the Helena diocese was left \$15,000 by the deceased and Bishop Gilmore was named to distribute the bequest "wisely and charitably."
