Emil A. Berkland Dies of Injuries In Auto Accident

Emil A. Berkland, 24, died Sunday morning at the Whitefish hospital from injuries received in an automobile accident on Highway No. 93 about 300 feet south of the junction with the Whitefish-Columbia Falls road early Sunday. Authorities said he suffered a fractured skull, a compound fracture of the right leg and internal injuries.

A report of the accident by the state highway patrol said that Berkland's car went over the shoulder of the highway and after traveling about 200 feet rolled over three times and smashed into the sign post at the junction of the highways.

Lee Franklin, who was in the car with Berkland, escaped with minor injuries.

The ambulance was called from Whitefish and took Berkland to the hospital, where he died about 10:30 a. m. Highway patrol officers said the accident occurred about 5:30 a. m.

Berkland is survived by his parents, Mr. and Mrs. Arne Berkland, who live west of Kila, a sister living here and another sister living in Washington. Funeral services have been set for 2 p. m. Wednesday. The body is at the Waggener & Campbell Funeral home.

A. J. Brower of Polson is Called By Death Sunday

Polson, March 11.—(7)—Andrew J. Brower, 66, who served in both houses of the Montana legislature, died late Sunday at the St. Ignatius hospital after suffering a paralytic stroke.

Brower, known as the "father of Lake county," was stricken Thursday night while en route with James Harbert, clerk of the Lake county district court, to St. Ignatius to address a grange meeting.

Brower was one of the few men to represent two counties in the Montana legislature without changing his residence.

Before the creation of Lake county he served in the house as a representative from Missoula county and later as state senator. He was a republican.

In the 1939 session he was the representative from Lake county, carved out of portions of Missoula and Flathead counties.

Born in New York state, he came to Montana in 1910. For two years he was county attorney at Polson.

Funeral arrangements have not been completed, pending word from a daughter, Miss Virginia Brower of Glendale, Calif., other survivors include a brother, W. C. Brower of Clark, S. D., and a sister-in-law, Mrs. W. F. Hollingsworth of Ronan.
