**George Eckleberry
Drowned Thursday
While Duck Hunting**

George Eckleberry, 41, was drowned Thursday afternoon in Percy lake, two miles north of McWinginer slough, while attempting to recover ducks that had been shot.

According to companions, Eckleberry had waded out about 30 feet when he either stepped or slipped into a deep hole.

Clem Zook and Joe Leaf, both of Kalispell, were hunting with him, and say they had shot a couple of ducks on the far side of the lake, and decided to let them go. Eckleberry, however, insisted he could get them and after failing to find a way around the lake, said the water was only about up to his arm pits, and started to wade out. When about 30 feet from shore he went under but came up, saying his boots were too heavy to swim out. He then sank from sight and failed to reappear. Zook and Leaf had no boat or raft and were unable to rescue him. They then notified Mrs. Eckleberry at the farm home nearby, and drove to Kalispell to get assistance from the sheriff's force, which used a boat and grappling hooks and recovered the body in 10 feet of water at about 7:30. The tragedy occurred at about 4 o'clock in the afternoon.

Mr. Eckleberry had lived in this community all his life. He leaves his wife and small child, his parents, Mr. and Mrs. George Eckleberry, two brothers Gerald and Kenneth, and four sisters, Mrs. Frank Logan who lives north of Kalispell, Mrs. Ruth Olsen, Crookston, Minn., Mrs. Orissa Wendt, Columbia Falls, and Erma Benner of Sunburst, Montana.

The body is at the Waggener and Campbell funeral home and service arrangements are incomplete.

Bigfork Boy Dies Of Injuries When Car Strikes Sled

Norman Evensen, aged 12 years, son of Mr. and Mrs. Chris Evenson died of injuries Sunday shortly after he had been struck by a car near his home about nine miles south of Bigfork. The boy was sleigh riding down the road leading to his home and had just emerged onto the main highway when G. E. Bright of Creston struck the lad.

According to Highway Patrolman Morris Blake the accident was unavoidable and witnesses asserted that Mr. Bright made a desperate attempt to stop his car, but the slippery road rendered the brakes of his car useless.

Mr. Evensen, the boy's father, and an uncle, Ware Carlson, rushed the child to Dr. L. J. Leist's office at Bigfork, but he died before any aid could be given.

Patrolman Blake said the road down which the boy had been sliding emerged onto the highway from a cut, making it impossible for an oncoming motorist to see the road.

Funeral services will be held Wednesday at 2 p. m. at the Owen-Elliott chapel, with Rev. Boade of the Bigfork Lutheran church officiating. Burial will be made in the Conrad Memorial cemetery.
