George Eckleberry Drowned Thursday While Duck Hunting

George Eckleberry, 41, was drowned Thursday afternoon in Percy lake, two miles north of McWininger slough, while attempting to recover ducks that had been shot.

According to companions, Eckleberry had waded out about 30 feet when he either stepped or slipped into a deep hole.

Clem Zook and Joe Leaf, both of Kalispell, were hunting with him, and say they had shot a couple of ducks on the far side of the lake, and decided to let them go. Eckleberry, however, insisted he could get them and after failing to find a way around the lake, said the water was only about up to his arm pits, and started to wade out. When about 30 fect from shore he went under but came up, saying his boots were too heavy to swim out. He then sank from sight and failed to reappear. Zook and Leaf had no boat or raft and were unable to rescue him. They then notified Mrs. Eckleberry at the farm home nearby, and drove to Kal-ispell to get assistance from the sheriff's force, which used a boat and grappling hooks and recovered the body in 10 feet of water at about 7:30. The tragedy ocurred at about 4 o'clock in the afternoon.

Mr. Eckleberry had lived in this community all his life. He leaves his wife and small child, his parents, Mr. and Mrs. George Eckleberry, two brothers Gerald and Kenneth, and four sisters, Mrs. Frank Logan who lives north of Kalispell, Mrs. Ruth Olsen, Crookston, Minn, Mrs. Orisse Wendt, Columbia Falls, and Erma Benner of Sunburst, Montana.
