It was thought that the two men tried to change positions in the boat and capsized the craft during the move. A number of boats with fishermen near by saw their plight and rushed to their assistance, but both men sank at once and failed to come to the surface. A drag net was used to locate the bodies. There have been several accidents on the lake during the past, but this is the first downing on record, and this one was undoubtedly due to the type of boat used.
