Robert LaFrance, aged 15 years, son of Mr. and Mrs. John LaFrance, was instantly killed about 4 o'clock Saturday afternoon when struck by a log at the W. S. Penney sawmill east of the city limits.

He had followed a truck load of logs into the mill yard and when Mr. Penney started to unload he was not aware the boy was near. When the chains were loosened from the load, one of the legs rolled off striking Robert and crushing his skull. The log also broke his lcg as well as crushing him internally,

He was a freshman at St. Matthew's high school and although he was not employed at the mill he enjoyed being around the logging operations on Saturday.

Funeral services have been set for 10 o'clock Wednesday morning from the Catholic church, Rev. F. X. O'Farrell officiating. Burial will be made in the Conrad Memorial cemetery.
