FRED STRACK DIES OF BURNS RECEIVED WHEN OIL TANK OVERTURNS NEAR RONAN

ACCIDENT OCCURRED ABOUT 3:30 THIS MORNING — TURNED FROM HIGHWAY TO AVOID LIVESTOCK — LEAVES BRIDE OF ONLY THREE WEEKS

Fred Strack, an employee of the Aronow Refinery, died at 9:30 at the Ronan hospital this morning from severe burns received after the oil tanker he was driving overturned about two miles south of Ronan and was enveloped in flames.

The accident occurred about 3:30 this morning and from details available, he had turned the truck from the highway to avoid stock, hitting a side road which caused the trailer truck to overturn, and from which he was unable to extricate himself be-

fore being fatally burned. The truck and trailer was totally destroyed.

The victim, who was 26 years of age, was the son of Mr. and Mrs. Antone Strack of the Lower Valley. Besides his parents and several brothers and sisters, he leaves his bride of only three weeks. He was married to Lillian Spink, September 1.

The body is being brought to the Owen-Elliott Mortuary and funeral arrangements will be announced later.
