Early Homsteader Passes in Spokane

Josiah A. Elliott, 93, Civil war veteran, who died Thursday in Spokane, was well known in the Flathead, having been the first homsteader in the Thompson lakes region. Two daughters, Mrs. Phoebe Lang and Mrs. Eleanor Palm, still live at Yakt. A third surviving daughter, Miss Myrtle Elliott, resided with him in Spokane.

Mrs. Elliott died about a month ago. In 1939 the couple celebrated their golden wedding anniversary.

The Elliots homsteaded at Yakt in 1894, coming to this section of the state from Horse Plains, where Mrs. Elliott had been teaching. They were married there in 1889.

Mr. Elliott came to Montana in 1882 from Colorado, settling at Virginia City, earlier spending 10 years in the Yellowstone Park area before it had been developed. He enlisted in the 42nd Wisconsin regiment in 1864, with which he served until conclusion of the war between the states. He was born in Maine, July 25, 1848.

Funeral services were held for Mr. Elliott at Spokane this forenoon.

ROSS ERVIN

Apparently the victim of a heart attack, Ross Ervin, 66, former well known resident of Kalispell, died suddenly in Pomona, Calif., January 18, according to information received here.

Mr. Ervin was born at Foster, Missouri, in 1875, and grew to manhood there. He came to Kalispell about 1900 and was associated with the O'Neil Lumber company and the Northwestern Lumber company for several years.

He is survived by his widow, a daughter, Mrs. Francis Stanton of Covina, Calif., and two sons, Max of Ohio and Harold of Portland, Ore. Funeral services for Mr. Ervin were conducted January 21 at Pomona.
