Paul Foot, 53, World war veteran, and resident of this section for many years, died last evening near Babb, where he was employed by the Park Saddle Horse company.

Mr. Foot was attending a dance and suddenly collapsed, examination indicating he suffered a heart attack. Although having worked for the past several years, Mr. Foot has not been in the best of health. He was wounded in France while with the A.E.F.

For some time Mr. Foot had been carrying on ranching operations in the Niarada area and had gone to work for the Park Saddle Horse company only about a month ago.

He is survived by three brothers, Guy, of Kalispell, and Harold S. and Wait L., both of Niarada, an uncle, C. H. Foot of Kalispell, and an aunt, Mrs. Ida Anderson of Belgrade, Minnesota.

Funeral arrangements are incomplete.

#### AUTOPSY RESULTS EXPECTED MONDAY

Results of the autopsy performed on the body of little 29-months-old Arlin Fry, son of Mr. and Mrs. Robert H. Fry, who died suddenly Wednesday night, will probably not be known until Monday, Coroner Harry H. Campbell, who is awaiting a reply from Helena, said today.

Decision to hold the autopsy was made after rumors were spread that the child died of poisoning, presumably from poison thrown into the yard by a dog poisoner.

Although a few pieces of candy were found in the yard, officials pointed out that dog poisoners invariably used meat in distributing poison for dogs and that local chemical analysis of the candy showed no signs of poison.
