Pioneer, Attorney,  
Passes Suddenly**

The many friends of Herbert A. Kendall were greatly shocked to learn of his sudden death at his home early this morning.

Mr. Kendall has not been in the best of health for several months, but he had been up and about and attended to his business as usual up to the time of his death, which was due to a stroke.

He was one of Kalispell's pioneer attorneys, establishing practice of law here more than 35 years ago. For the past 12 years he was a member of the law firm of Kendall and Baldwin.

Surviving are his widow, Rose, and three daughters, Jeanne of Kalispell, Mrs. Hall Hobe of Alliance, Ohio, and Mrs. Kathleen Forhan of Great Falls.

Funeral arrangements have not yet been completed, and will be announced later. The body is at the Owen-Elliott mortuary.
